A number of your former teachers attended the 23nd annual Jericho High School Alumni Hall of Fame induction ceremony at the Jericho Public Library on April 11, 2013, and the dinner beforehand at the Milleridge Inn. Okay, okay: we didn't have the budget this year. But next year, for sure!




